Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus	Participants in community activities	<p>Capacity – in line with government guidance all spaces will now be used to their full capacity.</p> <p>Masks – Participants should be recommended to wear a mask – but also told that this is a personal choice</p> <p>Items such as colouring books, cards, percussion instruments etc, may be wiped and used on a single table by a single household.</p> <p>Anti-viral wipes and sanitiser will be provided at the entrance to community events and again on tables – all participants will be encouraged to use sanitiser on entry and exit at a minimum. Consideration should be given to further sanitiser use during longer events.</p> <p>Refreshments – Where an activity includes the provision of refreshments these should be served at the table to avoid crowding around the facilities. Clean cups and plates should be used for each serving and all items thoroughly cleaned after each use.</p>	As these events often attract our most vulnerable users, extra vigilance should be kept to ensure no one with symptoms is permitted to attend.
